The sixth Cambridgeshire Rapidplay, held on Sunday 29 April, attracted 76 entries, a record for Rapidplays held in Peterborough. Competitors came from a wide area, as far apart as Edinburgh, Derbyshire and Sussex. It was particularly pleasing to see so many junior players: in the Challengers Tournament eighteen were aged 13 or under.

The prizes were shared between local players and visitors. In the Open Ieuan Ward from Bishop's Stortford was the winner, followed by Cambridgeshire's Andrew Timosenko and Norman Hutchinson. Dean Hartley from Amber Valley in Derbyshire, a regular at our Rapidplays, was a popular winner of the Major Tournament. The Challengers produced a six-way tie for first place, including the youngest competitor Ieysaa bin-Suhail from Wisbech (aged 7) and Cambridge's Claudia Bazyk (aged 9).
